“In God Alone”

*“Find rest, O my soul, in God alone;
my hope comes from Him.
He alone is my rock and my salvation;
He is my fortress, I will not be shaken.”*

Psalm 62:5-6

Just like last week, this is another psalm written by David during the difficult days of his life. Sunday I mentioned a children’s book written by Judith Viorst entitled, “Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day”. As the title would suggest, little Alexander is having the worst possible day: gum in his hair, no prize in the cereal box, the teacher doesn’t like his drawing, etc.. All day long Alexander keeps saying, “If only I could move to Australia”, thinking that in Australia there are never any terrible, horrible, no good, very bad days.

We have all experienced these THNGVB days. For some it may be THNGVB weeks, years, lifetimes. God has never promised His people that we would be immune from problems, tragedies, illnesses, struggles. In fact Jesus prepared us that in this life there would in fact be difficulties. He said that the rain fell on the just and unjust, which also means that the drought fall on both as well. So the question to us in not “IF” we will have THNGVB days, but “HOW” will we handle them.

David shares his strategy: Trust in God alone. 4 times in this short psalm, David uses the word alone to describe his trust in God. We cannot place our ultimate trust anywhere else. Having friends, family, even our church family is important. However, people have a tendency and potential to let us down, no matter how well-meaning they are. Wealth and success are fleeting and in the end provide no hope or security. If our hope and trust and faith are in people and things, then we are on shaky ground when the THNGVB days come.

But God alone is our ultimate salvation, our rock and fortress. Not to take away the THNGVB days, but to shelter us though them. And then one day, God has promised to take us to a place where there are no THNGVD days. No Alexander, it’s not Australia. It’s HEAVEN!
