"Only A Few Find It"

As Jesus began to conclude the Sermon on the Mount, He calls for a decision. He says, "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the way that leads to life and only a few find it." (Matthew 7:13-14) That got me to thinking? Why do only a few find the road to life?

It's not because the destination is not appealing. Who doesn't want life over destruction? It's not because the road isn't well-marked. There is no doubt or ambiguity as to what God wants from us. It's not because God only wants a few find it. "For God so loved the whole world...". So why do few find it?

Others will miss it because they rely on their own knowledge or wisdom. There have been times in my life when I got lost because I was "sure" I knew the way. The Old Testament writer warned that, "It is not within man to guide his own steps". (Jeremiah 10:23).

Whatever the reason, the destination is the same: destruction. We must study God's word and listen to Him as He directs our steps to the path that leads to life. We want to be a part of the few who find it.

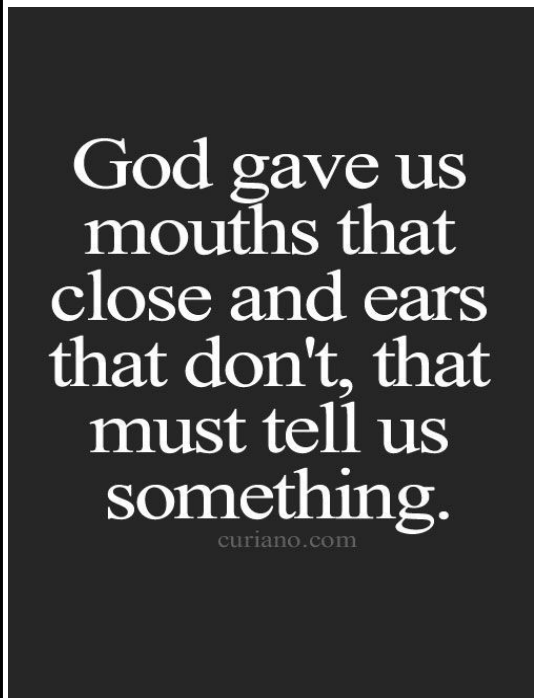
