"We Are Not Doing Right"

An interesting story is found in 2 Kings chapter 7. Samaria, the capital of the Northern Kingdom, is under siege by the Syrians. The situation was horrendous. Food was scarce and some of the inhabitants had even resorted to cannibalism. Four men with leprosy were outside the city gates, unable to enter because of their disease. They were between the proverbial "rock and hard place". They were starving where they were, they would be stoned if they entered the city and the Syrians would probably kill them soon. They decided to go to the Syrian camp and throw themselves at the mercy of their enemies. As they entered the camp they noticed a strange thing: the camp was empty of soldiers and all of their provisions had been abandoned. What they did not know is that the night before God had caused a panic in the camp and the army had fled quickly.

The four lepers ate and drank and then said to themselves, "*We are not doing right*". They knew they had a responsibility to tell those inside the city that the siege and famine were over. They had tasted the food and drink and now had to share it with others.

What a metaphor for us as Christians. We live in a world held siege by Satan and the horrendous effects of sin. People around us are starving spiritually and are in desperate need of relief. Yet, just like the lepers, we have tasted of the blessings of God. We have received the saving grace that comes through the Gospel of Christ. And we too are not doing right if we keep it to ourselves.

I want to encourage each of us to continue to pray for our evangelistic efforts. To pray for our own courage to share the good news with others. To pray for receptive hearts and minds. I also encourage each of us to identify those in our lives that are in need of the Gospel. It may be a family member, neighbor, friend or co-worker. It may be just someone who randomly comes into our life. Pray specifically for this person or persons. Opening our eyes and seeking God's guidance are the first steps in reaching the lost around us.

May God bless our efforts and may we "do right" by sharing what we have with others.

PRAYING FOR THE SICK

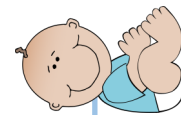
