“Shelter in the Storm”

A few nights ago, I was awake in the early hours while most people around were likely sleeping. Outside the lightning was flashing and I could hear the roar of thunder. The storm was real, but I felt safe, sheltered in the den where I was sitting. I thought of this as an analogy of the Christian experience. I also thought of a hymn we sometimes sing entitled, “Till the Storm Passes By”. That hymn is, in part, a prayer to the Lord to keep us safe “while the storm howls above” mid “the crash of the thunder”.

But I also thought of the basis of our hopes and prayers—the beautiful, wonderful assurance from God. The apostle Peter was inspired to write that through faith we “are shielded by God’s power” (1 Peter 1:5). When we keep the faith, the Lord keeps us. The apostle Paul and those travelling with him were caught in a very severe storm; but, in the midst of it he urged them to keep their courage saying, “I have faith in God” (Acts 27:44).

Long ago, Isaiah expressed his faith saying, “O Lord, You are my God.” And he added these very important words: “You have been a refuge for the poor, a refuge for the needy in his distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat” (Isaiah 15:1,4).

I do not recall a more stormy time than that now experienced in our society. Lives are in turmoil. Many have thrown away all the moorings and they are adrift without guidance. Moral decay surrounds us.

In the midst of it all, there is a shelter where we can be safe. The Lord is our stronghold and we do not need to be afraid (Psalm 27:1). “Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord” (Psalm 27:14)
